Progress Report Cards

Grade 1 - 8 students will receive an Progress Report on **Tuesday, November 21**. General progress in Learning Skills and Work Habits will be indicated on Page 1 through the use of these indicators: Excellent, Good, Satisfactory, Needs Improvement.

Learning Skills and Work Habits play a critical role in student achievement of curriculum expectations. This section is of importance, as it provides information regarding areas of strength and areas in which improvement may be needed.

General progress in working towards meeting the expectations in specific Subject Areas will be noted on Page 2. At this point in the school-year, when it is early to accurately assign a mark or grade (Level 1- 4, A, B, C, D or a percentage), your child's general progress will be indicated by one of following three descriptors; Progressing Very Well, Progressing Well, and Progressing with Difficulty.

The Progress Report Card will also help to focus dialogue between teachers, students and parents/guardians, to help establish next steps and set a positive tone for the remainder of the school year. Please take some time to review the progress report with your child and to complete the Student Comments section, if you wish.

Our Kindergarten students will be receiving their Communication of Learning, highlighting initial observations on Tuesday November 21st as well.

Water Testing Results @ OLF

At OLF, we are committed to providing safe drinking water for students and staff. We continue to ensure that we comply with all provincial regulations regarding flushing the water in our school. For your convenience, the letter containing sample results from the most recent water test is attached on the next page.

Bullying Prevention

Bullying is a form of repeated, persistent aggression intended to cause fear, distress or harm to another person's body, feelings, self-esteem, or reputation. Bullying occurs in a context where there is a real or perceived imbalance of power between the child who bullies and the child who is victimized (adapted from PPM 144). We do not tolerate any form of bullying and have some presentations lined up to help bring awareness to the topic and will communicate details with the school community once they are finalized.

OLF Healthy School tip of the Month: Cook Up Some Fun!

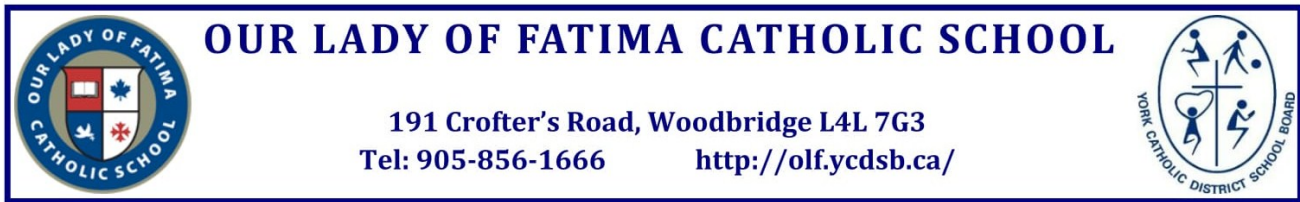
It is never too late to start cooking with your kids! Not only can it be a lot of fun, kids will naturally strengthen their literacy, math and science skills without even realizing it!

Dear Parents / Guardians,

This letter is a follow up to the communication sent home about water testing results for Our Lady of Fatima CES. This letter provides information about the legislation as well as the 2017 water testing results. All Standing and Flushed Samples collected from Our Lady of Fatima CES are **compliant**.

Prior to July 1, 2017, schools were required to take **one set** of samples, a Standing and a Flushed sample, annually at each school. This involved taking two one-litre water samples from one faucet in the school and having these samples tested for lead by a licensed laboratory.

Effective July 1, 2017, the YCDSB began testing **one third** of all drinking/food preparation faucets and fountains. This will be done annually to comply with changes made to Regulation 243/07, which are more prescriptive.

Standing sample: the water in the building had not flowed for six hours or more.

Flushed sample: the faucet is flushed for at least 5 minutes, turned off and left unused for 30 minutes. At the end of the 30 minutes, a second one-litre sample is taken. Results are a representation of the lead content in the drinking water after the required water flushing is conducted at the school.

On October 1, 2017, water samples were collected from faucets and drinking fountains at Our Lady of Fatima CES. All Standing and Flushed samples are well below the Ontario limit for lead in drinking water.

Flu Season is on its way – are you ready?



Flu season is nearly here. Be prepared by getting the flu shot as early as possible.

The first and best step to preventing influenza (the flu), is to get the flu shot every year. Influenza spreads quickly and easily from an infected person to others.

Everyone six months of age and older can get the flu shot.

Flu shots are available at:

- Health care provider's offices for people six months of age and older
- Participating pharmacies, for people five years of age and older

Visit ontario.ca/flu to find where you can get the flu shot.

How can the flu be avoided?

- Get the flu shot!
- [Wash your hands](#) well and often with soap and warm water. If soap and water are unavailable, use an alcohol-based [hand sanitizer](#)
- Cover your mouth and nose with a tissue when you cough or sneeze and throw the tissue out immediately. Wash your hands afterward. Cough into your upper sleeve if you don't have a tissue.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose and mouth
- Avoid large crowds and stay home when you are sick
- Keep common surfaces and items clean and disinfected
