DRESS CODE

Our Lady of Fatima CES is a standardized dress code school. Our dress code colours are navy blue and white. We encourage all students to follow the dress code policy at OLF. Please see the school website for specific information about appropriate dress code items.

LATE STUDENTS

A reminder that our entry bell rings at 8:50 am. Students that enter the building after the 8:50 am bell are considered late and will marked late on their attendance. Students who enter through the main doors after the 8:50 am bell must sign in at the front foyer.

Students who are continuously late are missing out on valuable learning time.

WINTER TEMPERATURE THRESHOLD

Winter months are ahead of us and it is important that students are coming to school appropriately dressed for the winter weather. This year, our temperature threshold has been set to -20 degrees celsius. This means that if the temperature, combined with the windchill is warmer than -20 degrees celsius, students will be going outside for recess.

Students should also be coming to school with an extra change of clothes and a pair of indoor shoes.

PROGRESS REPORTS & PARENT TEACHER INTERVIEWS



Grade 1-8 students will have access to their child's Progress Report on **Tuesday**, **November 14**. General progress in Learning Skills and Work Habits will be indicated on Page 1 through the use of these indicators: Excellent, Good, Satisfactory, Needs Improvement. Learning Skills and Work Habits play a critical role in student achievement of curriculum expectations. This section is of importance, as it provides information regarding areas of strength and areas in which improvement may be needed.

At this point in the school-year, when it is early to accurately assign a mark or grade, your child's general progress will be indicated by one of the following three descriptors; Progressing Very Well, Progressing Well, and Progressing with Difficulty. The Progress Report Card will also help to focus dialogue between teachers, students and parents/guardians, to help establish next steps and set a positive tone for the remainder of the school year. Please take some time to review the progress report with your child and to complete the Student Comments section, if you wish. Our Kindergarten students will be receiving their Communication of Learning, highlighting initial observations on Tuesday, November 15th, as well. Both documents will be made available to parents through the <u>YCDSB's Parent Portal</u>. Parent/Teacher interviews will be held from November 16-17 at Our Lady of Fatima.
